2D Matrix in billing data: a fraud case in pharmacy

Short description

Fraudulent invoicing of medicines not supplied but recorded with 2D Matrixes in billing data.

The aim of the Falsified Medicines European Directive regulation is to do everything possible to establish a system of unique identification, on the basis of which each medicine can be traced from production to the patient.

This unique identification calls 2D Matrix.

Marie-Anne Brabants, who is a NIHDI pharmacist-inspector and National Coordinator, will describe a pharmacy fraud case targeting 2D Matrix.

Defined goals

Explanations and questioning of the reliability of 2D Matrix data, presumably encoded in pharmacies.
