Current cybersecurity threat: top threats, major trends, threat actors and attack techniques

Short description

In 2023, the cybersecurity landscape witnessed a significant increase in both the variety and quantity of cyberattacks and their consequences. The ongoing war of aggression against Ukraine continued to influence the landscape. Maria Papaphilippou, Cybersecurity Officer at the European Union Agency for Cybersecurity (ENISA), will comment for us the ENISA Threat Landscape report for the health sector: she will explain the current state of cybersecurity mainly within the European Union (EU). She will provide insights into the reality of the health sector's trends in terms of cybersecurity threats, threat actors' activities, as well as vulnerabilities and cybersecurity incidents.

She will also go through the prime threats, actors, impact and trends based on the analysis of cyber attacks targeting health organisations over a period of more than 2 years.

The European Union Agency for Cybersecurity (ENISA) contributes to EU cyber policy, enhances the trustworthiness of ICT products, services and processes with cybersecurity certification schemes, cooperates with Member States and EU bodies, and helps Europe prepare for the cyber challenges of tomorrow.
